

Upper Guinea Special Liberia and Sierra Leone 2020 Tour Report

SUMMARY

The first ever birding tour to Liberia and our first Upper Guinea Special Tour (Liberia and Sierra Leone, combined) provided some spectacular birds and birding in this little-known region.

We started off in Liberia at Mount Nimba, where we comfortably accessed some of the best tropical forest on the continent. We found three groups of Sierra Leone Prinia, which required almost no walking, and enjoyed fantastic views of the rarely-seen Black-headed Rufous Warbler. The scarce Nimba Flycatcher was seen well twice and we found Gola Malimbe nest building on a day trip from our air-conditioned hotel. Other highlights included Little Grey Flycatcher, Yellow-bearded Greenbul, Sharpe's Apalis, Kemp's Longbill and Buff-throated Sunbird. From here we made the jaw-rattling journey to Sapo National Park via Zwerdu, visiting both the north and west of the park. The lowland forest birding was spectacular and we saw Yellow-casqued Wattled Hornbill, Gola Malimbe (six times!), Red-fronted Antpecker, Timneh Parrot, Akun Eagle-Owl, Grey Ground Thrush, Rufous-winged Illadopsis, Olivaceous Flycatcher, Grey-hooded Capuchin Babbler and

Lowland Akalat, before returning to Monrovia. From Monrovia we made the easy journey to eastern Sierra Leone, crossing the border without hassle, and finding a lovely male Crimson Seedcracker on our way to Tiwai Island. Our first full day at Tiwai produced arguably the best 24 hours of the trip, starting off with a displaying White-crested Tiger Heron and ending with halfhour-long views of Rufous Fishing Owl and pointblank views of African Pitta. We also saw Spotted Honeyguide. The birding at Gola forest was rather disappointing, although we did see Yellow-headed Picathartes, Latham's Forest Francolin on a night roost and Grey-hooded Capuchin Babbler. Our final stint of birding was done in the savannas of northern Sierra Leone, with Emerald Starling and Yellow-winged Pytilia in the Tingi Hills and Emerald Starling, Turati's Boubou, Togo Paradise Whydah and the rarely-seen Baumann's Greenbul at Bambuna.

REPORT

Our tour kicked off on the eastern side of Monrovia, and the following morning we enjoyed our first birds in the lodge grounds, including West African Wattle-eye, Sabine's Puffback, Red-chested Goshawk, White-browed Forest Flycatcher and Grey-headed Bristlebill (the early arrivals had already seen Red-cheeked Wattle-eye the day before). After breakfast we started our journey north towards Mount Nimba on a newly-paved road. Towards Ganta we paused for a leg stretch at a roadside pond where African Pygmy Goose was found and Tiny Sunbird fed in some flowering trees. We arrived in time for some introductory birding, before settling into our hotel for the next six nights.

Mount Nimba, sub-Saharan Africa's highest mountain west of Mount Cameroon, holds some of the richest forests on the continent that were the subject of an intensive ornithological study 50 years ago before iron-ore mining wrecked the top of the mountain. Mining operations ceased some time ago and moved to some of the nearby mountains, and since then the habitat on Mt Nimba has recovered somewhat and the East Nimba Nature Reserve was proclaimed to protect the habitat. Unfortunately most of the surrounding lowland forest falls outside of the reserve and is being hacked away, and many of the early, mouthwatering finds come from these forests that are no longer pristine.

Still, Nimba offers spectacular birding with easy access to the habitats at the top of the mountain, and must rank as the place in the world requiring the least effort to see the localised Sierra Leone Prinia. It was to this species that we first turned our attention, and on our first morning we found a party of these furtive little birds which gave reasonable views. Wider exploration turned up another two groups, but they were generally uncooperative so we were pleased to have had reasonable looks on our first attempt. The surrounding lowlands are home to another tricky species, the fantastic Black-headed Rufous Warbler, and on our second morning we enjoyed spectacular views of this rarely-seen specialty, finding another two pairs later. Our third day was

focussed on tracking down another rarity bearing the mountain's name, Nimba Flycatcher, and late in the afternoon we enjoyed some good views of a singing bird, with another bird the next morning giving even better views. The fourth speciality of the area is the striking Gola Malimbe, and on our final day in the area we made a day trip to see this special bird, with two males found nest building after about a three kilometre walk; so much easier than seeing them in Gola in Sierra Leone.

There were plenty of other birds on offer too and we racked up a long list of species. Highlights included several lekking male Standard-winged Nightjar, brilliant views of a grey-morph Plain Nightjar, a pair of secretive Blue-moustached Beeeater, several scarce Little Grey Flycatcher, and the regional endemics Ahanta Francolin, Melancholy Woodpecker, Little Green Woodpecker, Rufousbellied Wattle-eye, Western Yellow-billed Barbet, Western Square-tailed Drongo, Western Bearded Greenbul, Yellow-bearded Greenbul, Kemp's Longbill, Sharpe's Apalis, Finsch's Flycatcher Thrush, Ussher's Flycatcher, Western Forest Robin and Buff-throated Sunbird. Other species recorded include Double-spurred Francolin, Sabine's Spinetail, Alpine Swift, Pallid Swift, Guinea Turaco, Western Plantain-eater, Black-throated Coucal, European Honey Buzzard, Crowned Eagle, Cassin's Hawk-Eagle, Blue-throated Roller,

Grey-headed Kingfisher, Black Bee-eater, Whitethroated Bee-eater, Naked-faced Barbet, Speckled Tinkerbird, Red-rumped Tinkerbird, Yellowthroated Tinkerbird, Yellow-rumped Tinkerbird, Yellow-spotted Barbet, Cassin's Honeybird, Common Kestrel, West African Batis, Manycoloured Bushshrike, Brown-crowned Tchagra, Lowland Sooty Boubou, Red-billed Helmetshrike, Red-shouldered Cuckooshrike, Purple-throated Cuckooshrike, Blue Cuckooshrike, Shining Drongo, Blue-headed Crested Flycatcher, Redbellied Paradise Flycatcher, Dusky Tit, Little Grey Greenbul, Ansorge's Greenbul, Plain Greenbul, Golden Greenbul, Spotted Greenbul, Swamp Palm Bulbul, Red-tailed Leaflove, Red-tailed Greenbul, Square-tailed Saw-wing, Lesser Striped Swallow, Grey Longbill, Green Crombec, Lemon-bellied Crombec, Chestnut-capped Flycatcher, Green Hylia, Tit Hylia, Black-capped Apalis, Yellowbrowed Camaroptera, Olive-green Camaroptera, Rufous-crowned Eremomela, Blackcap Illadopsis, Brown Illadopsis, Fraser's Forest Flycatcher, Dusky-blue Flycatcher, Grey-winged Robin-Chat (heard), African Stonechat, Little Green Sunbird, Yellow-chinned Sunbird, Red-vented Malimbe, Blue-billed Malimbe, Crested Malimbe, Whitebreasted Nigrita, Chestnut-breasted Nigrita, Orange-cheeked Waxbill, Common Waxbill, Longbilled Pipit and Gosling's Bunting (second record for Liberia).

After some final birding in the Nimba area we started the longer-than-expected journey to Sapo National Park, with a night in Zwerdu en route. Although the distances were small and the roads dry, the road surfaces were atrocious and we spent many hours grinding our way to the fantastic lowland forests of Sapo. En route a lunch stop turned up Fanti Drongo which was mobbing a Fraser's Eagle-Owl, a little taste of what was to come.

Finally we arrived at Sapo, and now entered camping mode for the next five nights, split between the north and west of the park. Our first camp site was positioned on the edge of a forest clearing, and while setting up camp we were entertained and distracted by numerous birds. Western Pied Hornbill, Western Piping Hornbill,

Brown-cheeked Hornbill, Black-casqued Hornbill and Yellow-casqued Hornbill were joined by Timneh Parrot and Fire-bellied Woodpecker to welcome us, and as the sun set a pair of Spotbreasted Ibis passed by in the half light. After dusk the night sounds of African Palm Civets, Western Tree Hyrax and Hammer-headed Fruit-Bat started up around us and the cacophony of mammals was joined by Akun Eagle-Owl, which showed fantastically in the torch beam. The next day and a bit we took our time to explore the surrounding forest, with our main aim of finding Whitebreasted Guineafowl. Although we heard them once and found a recently-hatched egg shell, we failed to lay eyes on this species, probably very shy due to hunting pressure. Still a good selection of other species was found, including Latham's Forest

Francolin, Lowland Akalat, Blue-headed Wood Dove, Red-billed Dwarf Hornbill, Chocolatebacked Kingfisher, African Dwarf Kingfisher, Brown-eared Woodpecker, Rufous-sided Broadbill, Dusky Crested Flycatcher at the nest, Rufouswinged Illadopsis, Pale-breasted Illadopsis, Whitetailed Alethe, Olivaceous Flycatcher, more Gola Malimbes and, on the walk out, a pair of preening Red-fronted Antpeckers. We now relocated to the western edge of the park (with Magpie Mannikin en route), and here spent a rather quiet day exploring the swamp forests around the Sinoe River. White-throated Blue Swallow and Cassin's Flycatcher were active along the river itself. The highlight of the morning, although we only saw it in flight, was a Grey Ground Thrush that called (contact call) persistently and flew past us giving brief views. We also glimpsed Dusky Long-tailed Cuckoo and Olive Long-tailed Cuckoo, both quite vocal, and partly won a tussle with a party of Greyhooded Capuchin Babbler, with everyone laying eyes on them in the end. Sadly our time at Sapo had come to an end and we completed our loop back to Monrovia with another bum-numbing journey, broken by views of Rock Pratincole, Preuss's Cliff Swallow, Chestnut-and-black Weaver and Orange Weaver, before spending a night in the lap of luxury near Monrovia (well-deserved after five nights in a tent).



The next phase of the trip now began, as we made the easy trip west from Monrovia to the border with Sierra Leone, a tar road taking us all the way. Although immigration formalities took some time there we no issues and we crossed the border before making the short journey to Tiwai Island, a lovely male Crimson Seedcracker sitting up for the scope in a roadside swamp along the way.

We had two nights at Tiwai, where the focus of our time was on the picturesque Moa River accessed during three trips on boat and canoe. Our first trip was a bit short and failed to turn up anything of note, but on our first morning (and second boat trip) we hit the jackpot with a displaying Whitecrested Tiger Heron that kept us enthralled until first light. Our third trip turned up spectacular views of the scarce Rufous Fishing Owl, which was admired at length. Other birds seen along the river included Hartlaub's Duck, Blue-cheeked Bee-eater, African Finfoot, Brown Nightjar (heard only), Egyptian Plover, Rock Pratincole, White-throated Blue Swallow, Mangrove Sunbird, White-browed Forest Flycatcher and Cassin's Flycatcher. The forest on the island was fairly quiet, but we did see

manage to see Black Sparrowhawk, African Wood Owl, Western White-crested Hornbill, Chocolatebacked Kingfisher, African Dwarf Kingfisher, Spotted Honeyguide, Buff-spotted Woodpecker, Forest Chestnut-winged Starling, Western Forest Robin , Yellow-mantled Weaver, Maxwell's Black Weaver and, best of all, an incredible African Pitta on a night roost. Nkulengu Rail called after dark but the undergrowth was too dense to reach the roost site.

From Tiwai we made our way to the nearby Gola Forest, pausing for supplies in Zimmi where House Sparrow (perhaps the first record for Sierra Leone) was resident around the fuel station. Our first stop was at Gola East, where a day spent in beautiful forest turned up little new other than Hairybreasted Barbet and our best views of Whitetailed Alethe. The adjacent farmbush was more productive though and here we found Red-cheeked Wattle-eye, White-throated Greenbul, Puvel's Illadopsis and Grey-hooded Capuchin Babbler. After dark we spotted Western Crested Guineafowl roosting. Moving onto Gola North we started off with a picathartes vigil, with one bird coming to the inactive breeding colony in the evening, the walk back producing a female, and then a striking male, Latham's Forest Francolin on the roost. The next day we made the long hike into the centre of Gola North, aiming to camp on the edge of the primary forest. Black-shouldered Nightjar gave good views around our lodgings before we set off on the nine kilometre hike along a well-maintained trail. Birding was slow in the understorey, but a few active ant swarms turned up some memorable birds, the best of which were White-bellied

Kingfisher (for some) and Brown-chested Alethe. A day in the primary forest produced Long-tailed Hawk, Narina Trogon, Rufous-sided Broadbill, Rufous-bellied Wattle-eye, Green-tailed Bristlebill, Forest Scrub Robin and Gola Malimbe. Lagden's Bushshrike called a couple of times but refused to show. The final bit of birding at Gola North was in the more productive farmbush, and a few hours here produced Cassin's Spinetail, African Cuckoo-Hawk, Western Yellow-billed Barbet, Willcocks's Honeyguide, Fire-bellied Woodpecker, Timneh Parrot, Copper-tailed Starling, Buff-throated Sunbird and Johanna's Sunbird.



The end of the trip was now near and the final bit of birding was focussed on the savannas of northern Sierra Leone, which made a nice change from the forest-biased birding we had been doing for the past two weeks. Certainly birds were much easier to see. On our way north to Kono we paused at the rice fields near Kanema, seeing Little Ringed Plover, Forbes's Plover and Black-backed Cisticola during our short visit. North of Kono in the Tingi Hills we enjoyed a very productive couple of hours, quite quickly finding the much-desired Emerald Starling, with about ten birds seen. Other species in the surrounds included Vieillot's Barbet, African Grey Woodpecker, Senegal Batis, Tropical Boubou, Western Square-tailed Drongo (in gallery forest), White-shouldered Black Tit, Fanti Saw-wing, Senegal Eremomela, Splendid Sunbird, Yellowwinged Pytilia, Black-bellied Firefinch, Red-billed Firefinch and Magpie Mannikin. We also spent some time looking for Togo Paradise Whydah, but drew a blank.

Our final stop of the trip was at Bumbuna, where Standard-winged Nightjar was seen pre-dawn and Turati's Boubou seen well shortly after dawn. Here the open farmbush was very productive and we found a fantastic male Togo Paradise Whydah in full breeding plumage and several Cameroon Indigobirds. Other species recorded included Black-and-white Shrike-Flycatcher, Fanti Sawwing, Melodious Warbler, Red-winged Warbler, Senegal Eremomela, Emerald Starling, Olive-naped Weaver, Red-headed Quelea and African Firefinch. The final bird of note, just before we started our drive to the airport for the end of the tour, was the little-known Baumann's Olive Greenbul, a species we had spent hours looking for over the previous two weeks. It look a bit of persuasion, but after some persistence we managed to lure one bird from its thickets for good views. Hurrah!!

ANNOTATED SPECIES LIST

Numididae

White-breasted Guineafowl Agelastes meleagrides --- Heard at Sapo North, where a recently-hatched egg was found

Helmeted Guineafowl Numida meleagris --- Good numbers in the Bumbuna area (galeatus)

Western Crested Guineafowl [Crested

Guineafowl] *Guttera* [*pucherani*] *verreauxi* --- Two an a roost at Gola East (*verreauxi*)

Phasianidae

Latham's Forest Francolin *Peliperdix lathami* --- Brilliant night-time views of a female on the ground and a male in a tree at Gola North. Also seen more briefly at Sapo North and Gola North (*lathami*)

Ahanta Francolin *Pternistis ahantensis* --- Two reasonable day-time views at Nimba, and heard at Bumbuna (*ahantensis*)

Double-spurred Francolin *Pternistis bicalcaratus* ---- Seen at Mt Nimba and Bumbuna and heard in the Tingi Hills (*thornei*)

Anatidae

Hartlaub's Duck *Pteronetta hartlaubii* --- Excellent views at Tiwai, and also seen at Sapo North, Nimba and Bumbuna

African Pygmy Goose *Nettapus auritus* --- Three on a lake in the Ganta area of Liberia

Caprimulgidae

Brown Nightjar *Veles binotatus* --- Heard at Tiwai where we were too busy looking at White-crested Tiger Heron and Rufous Fishing Owl to find it

Black-shouldered Nightjar [Fiery-necked

Nightjar] *Caprimulgus* [*pectoralis*] *nigriscapularis* --- Super views at Gola North, and also seen at Mt Nimba

Plain Nightjar Caprimulgus inornatus ---

Incredible views of a grey-morph bird on Mt Nimba

Standard-winged Nightjar *Caprimulgus longipennis* --- Brilliant views of several males lekking at Nimba, and also seen at Bumbuna

Apodidae

Sabine's Spinetail *Rhaphidura sabini* --- Seen at Nimba and Gola North

Cassin's Spinetail *Neafrapus cassini ---* Seen at Gola North

African Palm Swift *Cypsiurus [parvus] parvus* --- Seen widely in Sierra Leone (probably *brachypterus*)

Alpine Swift Tachymarptis melba --- Seen on top of Mt Nimba (melba)

Common Swift *Apus apus ---* Seen widely in Liberia and Sierra Leone (*apus*)

Pallid Swift *Apus pallidus* ---- Seen on top of Mt Nimba (subspecies not determined)

Little Swift *Apus affinis* --- Scattered sightings in Liberia and Sierra Leone (*aerobates*)

Musophagidae

Great Blue Turaco *Corythaeola cristata* ---Widespread sightings

Guinea Turaco Tauraco persa --- Seen at Mt Nimba, Tingi Hills and Bumbuna (*buffoni*)

Yellow-billed Turaco *Tauraco macrorhynchus* ----Seen widely (*macrorhynchus*)

Violet Turaco *Musophaga violacea* --- Heard at Bumbuna

Western Plantain-eater Crinifer piscator --- Seen at Nimba and Bumbuna

Cuculidae

Black-throated Coucal *Centropus leucogaster* --- Seen at Mt Nimba and heard elsewhere (*leucogaster*)

Senegal Coucal *Centropus senegalensis* ----Widespread sightings (*senegalensis*)

Blue Yellowbill [Yellowbill] *Ceuthmochares* [aereus] aereus --- Widespread sightings

Diederik Cuckoo *Chrysococcyx caprius* --- Seen at Gola North (*flavirostris*)

Klaas's Cuckoo Chrysococcyx klaas --- Widespread records

African Emerald Cuckoo Chrysococcyx cupreus ---Widespread records

Dusky Long-tailed Cuckoo *Cercococcyx mechowi* --- Heard and seen very briefly at Sapo HQ (a proposed split as Whistling Long-tailed Cuckoo *C. lemaireae*)

Olive Long-tailed Cuckoo *Cercococcyx olivinus* ---- Heard and seen very briefly at Sapo HQ, and heard at Gola

Black Cuckoo *Cuculus clamosus* --- Heard in Liberia and Sierra Leone (*gabonensis*)

Red-chested Cuckoo *Cuculus solitarius* --- Heard at Gola East

African Cuckoo Cuculus gularis --- One seen well in the Tingi Hills

Columbidae

Rock Dove or Feral Pigeon Columba livia --- Seen

Afep Pigeon *Columba unicincta* --- Heard at Sapo North and Gola North

Western Bronze-naped Pigeon Columba iriditorques --- Heard very regularly and seen once

Lemon Dove *Columba larvata* --- Heard at Gola North and seen briefly at Mt Nimba (*inornata*)

Red-eyed Dove *Streptopelia semitorquata* ---Widespread

Vinaceous Dove *Streptopelia vinacea* --- Seen at Tingi Hills and Bumbuna

Laughing Dove Spilopelia senegalensis --- Seen at Yekepa and Zimmi (senegalensis)

Blue-spotted Wood Dove *Turtur afer* ----Widespread sightings

Tambourine Dove Turtur tympanistria ---Widespread sightings

Blue-headed Wood Dove *Turtur brehmeri* ---Incredible views at Sapo North and Nimba, and heard elsewhere (*infelix*) African Green Pigeon *Treron* [calvus] calvus ----Seen regularly in small numbers (sharpei)

Sarothruridae

White-spotted Flufftail *Sarothrura pulchra ---*Heard several times (*pulchra*)

Red-chested Flufftail *Sarothrura rufa* --- Heard at Bumbuna (*bonapartii*)

Heliornithidae

African Finfoot *Podica senegalensis* --- Great views at Tiwai (*senegalensis*)

Rallidae

Nkulengu Rail *Himantornis haematopus* --- Heard at Tiwai and Gola, but from inaccessible sites

Black Crake *Amaurornis flavirostra* --- Seen at Kanema

Charadriidae

Little Ringed Plover Charadrius dubius --- Several at Kanema (curonicus)

Forbes's Plover *Charadrius forbesi* ---- Great views of several at Kanema

Pluvianidae

Egyptian Plover *Pluvianus aegyptius* --- One at Tiwai

Jacanidae

African Jacana *Actophilornis africanus* --- Seen a couple of times

Scolopacidae

Common Sandpiper *Actitis hypoleucos* --- A couple of sightings

Wood Sandpiper *Tringa glareola* --- Seen at Kanema

Glareolidae

Rock Pratincole *Glareola nuchalis* --- Seen in good numbers at Tiwai, and also between Sapo and Monrovia (*liberiae*)

Ciconiidae

African Openbill Anastomus lamelligerus --- One at Tiwai (lamelligerus)

African Woolly-necked Stork [Woolly-necked Stork] *Ciconia [episcopus] microscelis* --- Seen at Sapo and Gola

Phalacrocoracidae

Reed Cormorant *Microcarbo africanus* --- Seen at Yekepa and Tiwai (*africanus*)

Threskiornithidae

Spot-breasted Ibis *Bostrychia rara* --- Heard and seen by some flying at dusk at Sapo North

Hadada Ibis Bostrychia hagedash --- Seen at Tiwai (brevirostris)

Ardeidae

White-crested Tiger Heron *Tigriornis leucolopha* ---- Incredible views of a displaying bird at Tiwai

Striated Heron *Butorides* [*striata*] *striata* --- Seen at Nimba and Sapo (*atricapilla*)

Squacco Heron Ardeola ralloides --- Seen at Kanema

Western Cattle Egret [Cattle Egret] Bubulcus [ibis] ibis --- Widespread sightings

Black-headed Heron *Ardea melanocephala* --- One at Lungi after the tour officially ended

Purple Heron *Ardea purpurea* --- One between Sapo and Monrovia (*purpurea*)

African Great Egret [Great Egret] Ardea [alba] melanorhynchos --- Seen at Kanema

Yellow-billed Egret [Intermediate Egret] Ardea [intermedia] brachyrhyncha --- Seen at Kanema and Tingi

Little Egret Egretta [garzetta] garzetta --- Seen once by Julian (garzetta)

Accipitridae

African Harrier-Hawk *Polyboroides typus ---*Widespread and common (*pectoralis*)

Palm-nut Vulture *Gypohierax angolensis* ----Widespread sightings

European Honey Buzzard *Pernis apivorus* ----Three sightings in Liberia African Cuckoo-Hawk *Aviceda cuculoides* ---Great views at Gola North, and also seen in the Sapo area by some (*batesi*)

Hooded Vulture Necrosyrtes monachus --- Seen at Kanema and Tingi

Bat Hawk *Macheiramphus alcinus ---* One for Callan near Yekepa (*anderssoni*)

Mangrove Sunbird *Anthreptes gabonicus* --- Seen at Tiwai and Gola East

Little Green Sunbird *Anthreptes seimundi* ---Quite common at Nimba and also seen at Gola (*kruensis*) Yellow-chinned Sunbird [Grey-chinned Sunbird] Anthreptes [rectirostris] rectirostris --- Seen at Nimba, Tiwai and Gola

Collared Sunbird *Hedydipna collaris* ---Widespread sightings (*subcollaris*)

Green-headed Sunbird *Cyanomitra verticalis* ----Recorded at Nimba, Tingi and Lungi (*verticalis*)

Blue-throated Brown Sunbird *Cyanomitra cyanolaema ---* Widespread sightings in forest (*magnirostrata*)

Olive Sunbird *Cyanomitra olivacea* --- Widespread sightings in forest (*guineensis*)

Buff-throated Sunbird *Chalcomitra adelberti* ---Our best views were at Gola North, but also seen at Nimba (*adelberti*)

Olive-bellied Sunbird *Cinnyris chloropygius* ----Widespread sightings (*kempi*)

Tiny Sunbird *Cinnyris minullus* --- Seen at Nimba and Gola (*minullus*)

Splendid Sunbird *Cinnyris coccinigastrus* ---- Seen at Tingi

Johanna's Sunbird *Cinnyris johannae* ----Widespread sightings in forest (*fasciatus*)

Superb Sunbird Cinnyris superbus --- Seen at Nimba and Gola North (ashantiensis)

Variable Sunbird *Cinnyris venustus* ---- Seen at Nimba, Tingi and Bumbuna (*venustus*)

Passeridae

House Sparrow Passer domesticus --- Seen at Monrovia, Ganta and Zimmi

Northern Grey-headed Sparrow Passer [griseus] griseus --- Seen at Yekepa and Lungi (griseus)

Bush Petronia Gymnoris dentata --- Seen at Tingi

Ploceidae

Olive-naped Weaver [Black-necked Weaver] *Ploceus [nigricollis] brachypterus --- Seen at Nimba,* Tingi and Bumbuna

Orange Weaver *Ploceus aurantius* --- Seen between Sapo and Monrovia (*aurantius*)

Chestnut-and-black Weaver [Vieillot's Black Weaver] *Ploceus [nigerrimus] castaneofuscus ---*Seen between Sapo and Monrovia, and widely in Sierra Leone

Yellow-mantled Weaver *Ploceus tricolor* --- Seen at Nimba and Tiwai (*tricolor*)

Maxwell's Black Weaver *Ploceus albinucha* ---Good views at Sapo, Gola and Tiwai (*albinucha*)

Gola Malimbe *Malimbus ballmanni* --- An incredible number of good sightings at Nimba (1), Sapo (6) and Gola (3)

Red-vented Malimbe *Malimbus scutatus* ----Several good sightings (*scutatus*)

Blue-billed Malimbe *Malimbus nitens* --- Small numbers seen in forest

Crested Malimbe *Malimbus malimbicus* --- Small numbers seen in forest (*nigrifrons*)

Red-headed Quelea *Quelea erythrops* ---- Seen at Bumbuna

Yellow-mantled Widowbird *Euplectes macroura* --- One at Bumbuna (*macroura*)

Estrildidae

Red-fronted Antpecker *Parmoptila rubrifrons* ----A pair seen well at Sapo North

White-breasted Nigrita Nigrita fusconotus --- Seen at Nimba (uropygialis)

Chestnut-breasted Nigrita *Nigrita bicolor* ---- Seen at Nimba, Sapo and Tiwai (*bicolor*)

Grey-headed Nigrita *Nigrita canicapillus* --- Seen in small numbers throughout (*emiliae*)

Yellow-winged Pytilia *Pytilia hypogrammica* ----Seen well at Tingi

Crimson Seedcracker *Pyrenestes sanguineus* --- A male seen well between Liberia and Tiwai (*coccineus*)

Western Bluebill Spermophaga haematina --- Seen at Sapo and Gola (haematina)

Black-bellied Firefinch Lagonosticta rara --- Seen at Tingi (forbesi)

Red-billed Firefinch *Lagonosticta senegala* --- Seen at Tingi and Lungi (*senegala*)

African Firefinch Lagonosticta [rubricata] rubricata --- Seen at Bumbuna and Tingi (polionota)

Orange-cheeked Waxbill *Estrilda melpoda ---*Seen at Nimba and Bumbuna (*melpoda*)

Common Waxbill *Estrilda [astrild] astrild ---* Seen at Nimba (*kempi*)

Bronze Mannikin *Lonchura cucullata* ---Widespread sightings (*cucullata*)

Black-and-white Mannikin Lonchura [bicolor] bicolor --- Widespread sightings (bicolor)

Magpie Mannikin *Lonchura fringilloides* --- Seen near Sapo and at Tingi

Viduidae

Cameroon Indigobird *Vidua camerunensis* --- A few seen at Bumbuna

Togo Paradise Whydah Vidua togoensis --- Great views of a male in full plumage at Bumbuna

Motacillidae

Western Yellow Wagtail *Motacilla flava* --- Seen at Nimba, Kanema, Tingi and Bumbuna (subspecies not determined)

African Pied Wagtail *Motacilla aguimp ---* Seen at Tiwai (*vidua*)

Yellow-throated Longclaw *Macronyx croceus* ----Seen at Bumbuna

Long-billed Pipit Anthus [similis] similis --- Seen well at Nimba (bannermani)

Plain-backed Pipit *Anthus leucophrys* --- Seen in the Nimba area (*gouldii*)

Tree Pipit *Anthus trivialis* --- Seen at Nimba, Tingi and Bumbuna (*trivialis*)

Fringillidae

Yellow-fronted Canary *Crithagra mozambica* ----Seen at Tingi (*caniceps*)

Emberizidae

Gosling's Bunting [Cinnamon-breasted Bunting] *Emberiza [tahapisi] goslingi ---* Seen at Nimba, Tingi and Bumbuna

Cabanis's Bunting *Emberiza cabanisi ---* One for Tertius at Tingi (*cabanisi*)
