# 2022 Tour Report

# **SUMMARY**

Our action-packed tour of northern Tanzania took in the famous wildlife-watching circuit, focussed on Tarangire, Ndutu, the Serengeti and Ngorongoro Crater, over 11 days. With comfortable accommodation throughout, over 460 bird species logged and impressive numbers and diversity of large mammals seen, all set against spectacular backdrops, northern Tanzania makes for the ultimate birding-and-wildlife getaway.

Avian highlights included the full compliment of Serengeti specials plus a variety of other uncommon species. During our first full day, spent at Arusha National Park, we found Kilimanjaro White-eye, Maccoa Duck, Eastern Bronze-naped Pigeon, Brown-breasted Barbet, Taveta Golden Weaver, Moustached Green Tinkerbird and Hartlaub's Turaco. En route to Tarangire we visited the Lariboro plains and surrounding habitats at Engikaret for a very productive morning, seeing Beesley's Lark, Athi Short-toed Lark, Red-throated Tit, Southern Grosbeak-Canary and Whiteheaded Mousebird. Tarangire and adjacent Lake Manyara held Ashy Starling, Yellow-collared Lovebird, Collared Palm-Thrush, Black Bishop, Cardinal Quelea, Gorgeous Sunbird, Black-faced Sandgrouse and Three-banded Courser, and our

first of many Lions. At Ndutu we enjoyed Greybreasted Spurfowl, Fischer's Lovebird, Rufoustailed Weaver, Yellow-throated Sandgrouse, Steel-blue Whydah, our first Cheetah and migrating Serengeti White-bearded Wildebeest. Moving on to Serengeti National Park, we saw Karamoja Apalis, Buff-bellied Penduline Tit, Grey-crested Helmetshrike, African Dusky Nightjar, Black Coucal, a three-male coalition of Cheetahs, a Leopard watching mating lions, a Leopard with two small cubs, and plenty of Lion and Spotted Hyaena. And finally, at Ngorongoro, highlights included Schalow's Turaco, Abyssinian Crimsonwing, the dazzling trio of Tacazze Sunbird, Malachite Sunbird, Golden-winged Sunbird and displaying Jackson's Widowbird.

# **REPORT**

We first gathered in the late afternoon at our lodge, conveniently situated near Kilimanjaro International Airport. A spot of introductory birding around the lodge grounds and nearby turned up the likes of Long-tailed Fiscal, Little Bee-eater, Buff-bellied Warbler, Spotted Palm Thrush, Variable Sunbird, Pangani Longclaw, African Silverbill and Reichenow's Seedeater. Afterwards, dinner was enjoyed, al fresco, with Slender-tailed Nightjar.

Early the next morning we set off on a day trip to the nearby Arusha National Park. Conditions overhead did not look too promising, and it rained on-and-off as we made our way to the park entrance. Before arriving we stopped for roadside colonies of Thick-billed Weaver, Taveta Golden Weaver and Speke's Weaver. While entrance formalities were completed at the gate we watched birds in the car park; African Stonechat, Singing

Cisticola, Taveta Golden Weaver, Baglafecht Weaver, Yellow Bishop and Cape Robin-Chat. Fortunately the rain had slowed down, but there was still some light drizzle so we keep the roof closed as we entered the park, initially passing through some moist savanna. We stopped for roadside Moustached Grass Warbler and Bronzy **Sunbird** soon after the entrance. A little further along an open, marshy area held Saddle-billed Stork and Hamerkop, and our first game: Bushbuck, Plains Zebra and Cape Buffalo.

Making our way to Ngurdutu Crater we paused for a circling Black Sparrowhawk, White-eared Barbet and Brown-breasted Barbet in some dead trees, Trilling Cisticola and Brown-hooded Kingfisher. We spent several hours working the forest on the crater rim and around one of the main view points, racking up a good list of birds; Mottled Swift, Nyanza Swift, striking

Hartlaub's Turaco, Green Yellowbill, a perched Eastern Bronze-naped Pigeon and Lemon Dove, displaying African Goshawk, Narina Trogon, point-blank views of Moustached Green Tinkerbird, a pair of Forest Batis, colourful Blackfronted Bushshrike, Cinnamon-chested Beeeater, skulking Placid Greenbul, Black-headed Apalis highly localised Kilimanjaro White-eye, Waller's Starling, Kenrick's Starling, White-eyed Slaty Flycatcher, Grev-headed Nigrita and Thickbilled Seedeater. In the afternoon we visited the Momella Lakes and surrounding savannas, finding Crowned Eagle, Broad-billed Roller, Red-tailed Shrike, White-fronted Bee-eater, Broad-tailed Warbler and Short-winged Cisticola. Impressive numbers of Greater Flamingo, Lesser Flamingo, Little Grebe, Cape Teal and variety of other waterbirds were spotted on the lakes, where the best find was a smart male Maccoa Duck.

The next morning we set off on our loop through northern Tanzania. We were a bit perturbed to spot seven House Crows on the roadside wires between Kilimanjaro Airport and Arusha; the

species seems to be spreading steadily westwards. From Arusha we made a short detour to the Lariboro Plains and surrounding bushveld at Engikaret. The open grasslands on the way turned up a good flock of Abdim's Stork and many **Horus Swift**. Once out on the plains we quickly spotted our first Kori Bustard, Chestnut-bellied Sandgrouse and Fischer's Sparrow-Lark, plus Athi Short-toed Lark on the ground, some fine Montagu's Harriers and displaying Singing Bush Lark. At first we struggled to join up with our local guides who were somewhere out on the vast plains waiting for us. After a few phone calls and wrong turns we finally found them, and were showed a pair of localised Beesley's Lark as soon as we stepped out of the vehicle. With the main target under the belt we had a good few hours to explore the plains and surrounding bush more widely. Fortunately the weather remained cool and bird activity high until into the mid afternoon when we left, and during the time we racked up a tremendous list of species: White-bellied Go-away-bird, Eastern Chanting Goshawk,

White-headed Mousebird, Red-fronted Barbet, Black-throated Barbet, Pygmy Falcon, Lesser Kestrel, Pygmy Batis, Rosy-patched Bushshrike, Taita Fiscal, Red-throated Tit, Mouse-coloured Penduline Tit, Foxy Lark, Short-tailed Lark, Eastern Crombec, Ashy Cisticola, Tiny Cisticola, Red-fronted Warbler, Grey Wren-Warbler, Yellow-bellied Eremomela, Banded Parisoma, Hildebrandt's Starling, Capped Wheatear, Bluecapped Cordon-bleu, Crimson-rumped Waxbill, Grey-headed Silverbill, Steel-blue Whydah and Southern Grosbeak-Canary! Afterwards, the drive onwards to the Tarangire-Manyara area produced Golden-backed Weaver, Southern Red Bishop, Cardinal Quelea, White-winged Widowbird, Rüppell's Vultures feeding at the roadside, Hooded Vulture and Knob-billed Duck.

The next day we made the most of visiting Tarangire National Park, arriving at the gates as soon as they were supposed to open, having spotted White-tailed Mongoose along the way. Unfortunately the gate clerk had other plans and we had to wait three quarters of an hour for her to arrive. Fortunately there were plenty of birds around and we watched Ashy Starling, Whitebrowed Sparrow-Weaver and Von der Decken's **Hornbill** as we waited. Once through the gates we could enjoy the full diversity of the park. Almost immediately we came across a pride of Lion with cubs beside of the road. First we worked some of the open savannas before making our way down to the river, completing a loop through the park over the course of the day. Memorable sightings include Yellow-necked Spurfowl, Red-necked Spurfowl,

Bare-faced Go-away-bird, White-bellied Bustard, good numbers of **Common Cuckoo**, some very fine Black-faced Sandgrouse, an incredibly tame Martial Eagle, low-circling African Hawk-Eagle, Abyssinian Scimitarbill, Southern Ground Hornbill, Lilac-breasted Roller, displaying Emin's Barbet, Eastern Grey Woodpecker, Bearded Woodpecker, African Orange-bellied Parrot, Yellow-collared Lovebird, Slate-coloured Boubou, Magpie Shrike, Red-rumped Swallow, Mosque Swallow, Northern Pied Babbler, Gorgeous Sunbird, Chestnut Sparrow, Rufoustailed Weaver, Chestnut Weaver, Cardinal Quelea, Black Bishop and Long-tailed Paradise Whydah. An early return to the lodge meant that people could put their feet up and enjoy the sunset over Lake Manyara.

The next day we started off birding near our lodge and along the shores of Lake Manyara. In the dark a Three-banded Courser showed well, and once it was light we found Grey Crowned

Crane, Double-banded Courser, Black Heron, Pink-backed Pelican, Blue-cheeked Bee-eater, Bare-eyed Thrush, Collared Palm Thrush and Black-necked Weaver before it was time to start our journey to Ndutu. We paused for a roadside Straw-tailed Whydah as we climbed into the highlands. At the gate to Ngorongoro we found Grey-capped Warbler and Brown-headed Apalis before enjoying a picnic lunch overlooking the crater, with three Black Rhinoceros visible below and Streaky Seedeater, Eastern Double-collared **Sunbird** and **Bar-throated Apalis** in the bushes next to us. Further along the crater rim we found a roadside Mountain Buzzard, before descending to the more arid, open plains in the rain shadow of the crater. Northern Anteater Chat, Blackwinged Lapwing, Usambiro Barbet and Isabelline Wheatear were spotted, and once we neared Ndutu we started to encounter large numbers of plains game; Thompson's Gazelle, Grant's Gazelle, Plains Zebra, Eland and, of course, many Serengeti White-bearded Wildebeest.


The following day and a bit were spent exploring the bush and plains in the Ndutu area. Several Lion sightings and our first Cheetah were the mammalian highlights, and on the avian front we found thousands and thousand of Wattled Starling, and more moderate numbers of Greybreasted Spurfowl, Coqui Francolin, Great Spotted Cuckoo, African Cuckoo, Yellowthroated Sandgrouse, Chestnut-banded Plover, Greater Painted-snipe, Secretarybird, Lappetfaced Vulture, Black-chested Snake Eagle, Gabar Goshawk, Red-and-yellow Barbet, Greater Honeyguide, Grey Kestrel, Fischer's Lovebird, Rufous Chatterer, Black-lored Babbler, Pale White-eye, Silverbird, Speckle-fronted Weaver, Green-winged Pytilia, Cut-throat Finch, Purple Grenadier, Black-faced Waxbill, Steel-blue Whydah, Straw-tailed Whydah and several Pearlspotted Owlet.

Next on the cards was Serengeti National Park, where we had 72 hours to explore widely. On our drive into Seronera we found several displaying Melodious Larks and our first Tanzanian Redbilled Hornbills. Our first full day was spent mainly along the Grumeti River to the west in successful search of Karamoja Apalis, Greycrested Helmetshrike and Buff-bellied Penduline Tit. Other goodies seen here were Lizard Buzzard, Dark Chanting Goshawk, Amur Falcon, Blackheaded Gonolek, White-tailed Lark, Grey-olive Greenbul, Red-fronted Tinkerbird, Longtailed Cisticola and Purple-banded Sunbird. Our second day was more mammal focussed, and started of with a female Leopard in a tree with two small cubs in the bushes below, then a mating pair of Lion watched at close range by another Leopard in a tree, a three-male coalition of cheetahs watching for lunch from a rock, and

then a good number of Spotted Hyaena and several more incredibly close lions encounters. However, we did not entirely neglect the birds and found Harlequin Quail, African Dusky Nightjar, Pallid Harrier, Verreaux's Eagle-Owl, Grey-rumped Swallow, Greater Kestrel, Broad-tailed Warbler, Fan-tailed Widowbird, African Quailfinch and Rosy-throated Longclaw. Returning south now we found White-headed Vulture and Pangani Longclaw before exiting the national park and continuing on to the renowned archaeological site of Oldupai Gorge for lunch. Our only flock of White Stork was seen en route — over 1000 strong. A birdy lunch overlooking the gorge was accompanied with Eastern Violet-backed Sunbird and **Black Bishop**, followed by a visit to the informative museum.

Our final destination of the trip was the incredible Ngorongoro Crater. We birded both the crater floor with its grasslands, wetlands and Acacia forests, and the Afromontane forests, shrublands and grasslands near to our lodge and along the rim. Having changed into a different habitat the new birds came thick and fast. Around our lodge we spotted a scarce male Abyssinian Crimsonwing feeding on the lawns, plus Hildebrandt's Francolin, Montane Nightjar, Schalow's Turaco, African Olive Pigeon, Dusky Turtle Dove, Mountain Yellow Warbler, Cinnamon Bracken Warbler, Hunter's Cisticola, Bar-throated Apalis, Brown-headed Apalis, Grey-capped Warbler, Brown Parisoma, Mbulu White-eye, Northern Olive Thrush, Tacazze Sunbird, Southern Citril, Yellow-crowned Canary and Eastern Double-



collared Sunbird. Down in the crater we enjoyed a mammal-and-bird-filled day which started with a pride of Lion breakfasting on Cape Buffalo carcass in the road, and a little later a clan of Spotted Hyaena doing the same. We eventually tore ourselves away to look at birds, finding Long-toed Lapwing, White-headed Barbet, Scaly-throated Honeyguide, Banded Martin, Highland Rush Warbler, Holub's Golden Weaver, Rosy-throated Longclaw and Grey Crowned Crane. Our final outing was spent a slightly higher altitudes were

we enjoyed dazzling Malachite Sunbird and Golden-winged Sunbird in superb light and found Red-naped Widowbird and lekking Jackson's Widowbird in short time. Sadly it was now time to head back to Arusha. We enjoyed our final meal— a late lunch— and birding at Duluti where Silvery-cheeked Hornbill, Crowned Hornbill, Rüppell's Robin-Chat and Red-backed Mannikin were spotted in the gardens, before it was time to head our separate ways.

## Struthionidae

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**Common Ostrich** *Struthio camelus* — Seen well at Ndutu, Ngorongoro and Serengeti NP

#### Numididae

Helmeted Guineafowl Numida meleagris — Common and widespread (reichenowi)

## Phasianidae

**Coqui Francolin** *Peliperdix coqui* — Great views at Ndutu (*hubbardi*)

**Crested Francolin** *Dendroperdix sephaena* — Seen at Arusha NP, and at Tarangire and Serengeti NP

**Scaly Francolin** *Pternistis squamatus* — A pair was seen briefly on the road at Arusha NP (*maranensis*)

**Hildebrandt's Francolin** *Pternistis hildebrandti* — Seen well at Ngorongoro (*hildebrandti*)

**Yellow-necked Spurfowl** *Pternistis leucoscepus* — Seen well at Tarangire

**Grey-breasted Spurfowl** *Pternistis rufopictus* — Excellent views at Ndutu and Serengeti NP

**Red-necked Spurfowl** *Pternistis afer* — Good views at Tarangire (*cranchii*)

**Common Quail** *Coturnix coturnix* — Heard at Ngorongoro (*africana*)

**Harlequin Quail** *Coturnix delegorguei* — One seen on the road and another four flushed at Serengeti NP (*delegorguei*)

#### Anatidae

White-faced Whistling Duck Dendrocygna viduata — Seen at Lake Manyara

**Spur-winged Goose** *Plectropterus gambensis* — Several sightings (*gambensis*)

**Knob-billed Duck** *Sarkidiornis* [*m.*] *melanotos* — Seen between Arusha and Tarangire

**Egyptian Goose** Alopochen aegyptiaca — Widespread sightings

**Blue-billed Teal** *Spatula hottentota* — Seen at Serengeti NP and Ngorongoro

**Yellow-billed Duck** *Anas undulata* — A few seen at Ngorongoro (*undulata*)

**Cape Teal** *Anas capensis* — Common at all saline waterbodies

**Red-billed Teal** *Anas erythrorhyncha* — Several scattered sightings

**Maccoa Duck** *Oxyura maccoa* — Nice views of a male at Arusha NP

## Caprimulgidae

**African Dusky Nightjar** *Caprimulgus fraenatus* — A pair was seen well at Serengeti NP

Montane Nightjar Caprimulgus [p.] poliocephalus — Great views at our lodge at Ngorongoro

**Slender-tailed Nightjar** *Caprimulgus clarus* — Seen several times

## Apodidae

**African Palm Swift** *Cypsiurus* [p.] parvus — Several sightings (brachypterus)

Mottled Swift Tachymarptis aequatorialis — Good views at Arusha NP and Ngorongoro (aequatorialis)

**Nyanza Swift** *Apus niansae* — Flocks were seen at Arusha NP and Ngorongoro (*niansae*)

**Little Swift** *Apus affinis* — Common throughout (*aerobates*?)

**Horus Swift** *Apus horus* — Seen in large numbers north of Arusha (*horus*)

**White-rumped Swift** *Apus caffer* — Several sightings

# Musophagidae

**Schalow's Turaco** *Tauraco schalowi* — Seen well at Ngorongoro

**Hartlaub's Turaco** *Tauraco hartlaubi* — Good views at Arusha NP

**Bare-faced Go-away-bird** *Corythaixoides* [*p.*] *personatus* — Seen well at Tarangire and Serengeti NP

**White-bellied Go-away-bird** *Corythaixoides leucogaster* — Seen at Engikaret and near Lake Manyara

## Otididae

**Kori Bustard** *Ardeotis kori* — Many great sightings, including males in display (*struthiunculus*)

White-bellied Bustard Eupodotis senegalensis — Good views at Tarangire and Serengeti NP (erlangeri)

Black-bellied Bustard Lissotis melanogaster
— Seen well at Serengeti NP and Ngorongoro
(melanogaster)

## Cuculidae

White-browed Coucal Centropus [s.] superciliosus — Widespread in small numbers (loandae?)

**Green Yellowbill [Yellowbill]** *Ceuthmochares* [aereus] australis — Good views at Arusha NP

**Great Spotted Cuckoo** *Clamator glandarius* — Seen at Ndutu and Serengeti NP

**Levaillant's Cuckoo** *Clamator levaillantii* — One seen at Serengeti NP

**Jacobin Cuckoo** *Clamator jacobinus* — Seen at Ndutu (probably *pica*)

**Diederik Cuckoo** *Chrysococcyx caprius* — Seen a few times

Klaas's Cuckoo Chrysococcyx klaas — Good views at Ndutu

African Emerald Cuckoo Chrysococcyx cupreus — Heard at Arusha NP

**Black Cuckoo** *Cuculus clamosus* — Seen near Lake Manyara (*clamosus*)

**Red-chested Cuckoo** *Cuculus solitarius* — Seen at Tarangire

African Cuckoo Cuculus gularis — Seen at Ndutu

**Common Cuckoo** *Cuculus canorus* — Good numbers seen at Tarangire

#### Pteroclidae

**Chestnut-bellied Sandgrouse** *Pterocles exustus* — Seen at Engikaret and Ndutu (*olivascens*)

**Yellow-throated Sandgrouse** *Pterocles gutturalis* — Good views at Ndutu (*saturatior*)

Black-faced Sandgrouse Pterocles decoratus — Good views at Tarangire (loveridgei)

#### Columbidae

Rock Dove or Feral Pigeon Columba livia — Seen

**Speckled Pigeon** *Columba guinea* — Several good sightings (*guinea*)

**African Olive Pigeon** *Columba arquatrix* — Seen perched at Ngorongoro

**Eastern Bronze-naped Pigeon** *Columba delegorguei* — Good views at Arusha NP, and heard at Ngorongoro

**Lemon Dove** *Columba larvata* — Seen well at Arusha NP (*larvata*)

**Dusky Turtle Dove** *Streptopelia lugens* — Good views at Ngorongoro

**African Mourning Dove** *Streptopelia decipiens* — Many sightings (*perspicillata*)

**Red-eyed Dove** *Streptopelia semitorquata* — Seen several times

**Ring-necked Dove / Cape Turtle Dove**Streptopelia capicola — Very common throughout (tropica)

**Laughing Dove** *Spilopelia senegalensis* — Fairly common throughout (*senegalensis*)

Emerald-spotted Wood Dove *Turtur chalcospilos*— Seen a few times

**Blue-spotted Wood Dove** *Turtur afer* — Heard at Serengeti NP

**Tambourine Dove** *Turtur tympanistria* — Seen well at Arusha NP

**Namaqua Dove** *Oena capensis* — Occasional sightings in drier area (*capensis*)

**African Green Pigeon** *Treron* [c.] calvus — Seen at Duluti (brevicera?)

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#### Rallidae

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**Black Crake** *Amaurornis flavirostra* — Good views at Serengeti NP

**Common Moorhen** *Gallinula chloropus* — Seen at Serengeti NP

**Red-knobbed Coot** *Fulica cristata* — Seen at Ngorongoro

#### Gruidae

**Grey Crowned Crane** *Balearica regulorum* — Great views near Lake Manyara and at Ngorongoro (*gibbericeps*)

## Podicipedidae

**Little Grebe** *Tachybaptus* [r.] ruficollis — Many seen (capensis)

## Phoenicopteridae

**Greater Flamingo** *Phoenicopterus roseus* — Seen several times

**Lesser Flamingo** *Phoeniconaias minor* — Several good sightings, especially at Ngorongoro

## Burhinidae

**Spotted Thick-knee** *Burhinus capensis* — Seen well at Serengeti NP

## Recurvirostridae

**Black-winged Stilt** *Himantopus* [h.] himantopus — Seen regularly

**Pied Avocet** *Recurvirostra avosetta* — Seen at Ndutu and Ngorongoro

## Charadriidae

**Long-toed Lapwing** *Vanellus crassirostris* — Several were seen at Ngorongoro (*crassirostris*)

**Blacksmith Lapwing** *Vanellus armatus* — Common around wetlands

**Spur-winged Lapwing** *Vanellus spinosus* — Seen at Arusha NP, Serengeti and Ngorongoro

**Black-winged Lapwing** *Vanellus melanopterus* — Good views at Serengeti NP and Ndutu (*minor*)

**Crowned Lapwing** *Vanellus coronatus* — Very common on dry grassy plains (*coronatus*)

**Common Ringed Plover** *Charadrius hiaticula* — Several sightings

**Kittlitz's Plover** *Charadrius pecuarius* — Seen at Lake Manyare, Serengeti NP and Ngorongoro

**Three-banded Plover** *Charadrius* [t.] tricollaris — Seen a few times

Chestnut-banded Plover Charadrius pallidus — Excellent views at Ndutu and Ngorongoro (venustus)

#### Rostratulidae

**Greater Painted-snipe** *Rostratula benghalensis* — Good views of a female and two males at Ndutu

#### Jacanidae

**African Jacana** *Actophilornis africanus* — Seen at Tarangire

## Scolopacidae

**Ruff** *Calidris pugnax* — Several good sightings

**Curlew Sandpiper** *Calidris ferruginea* — Seen at Ndutu and Ngorongoro

**Little Stint** *Calidris minuta* — Small numbers at scattered waterbodies

**Common Sandpiper** *Actitis hypoleucos* — Seen a few times

**Green Sandpiper** *Tringa ochropus* — One was seen near Kilimanjaro airport

**Marsh Sandpiper** *Tringa stagnatilis* — Seen a few times

**Wood Sandpiper** *Tringa glareola* — Seen fairly often

**Common Greenshank** *Tringa nebularia* — Seen a few times

#### Glareolidae

**Double-banded Courser** *Rhinoptilus africanus* — Good views at Ndutu and Serengeti, and near Lake Manyara

Three-banded Courser Rhinoptilus cinctus — Very good views near Lake Manyara and heard at Ndutu

Senegal Lesser Galago Galago senegalensis — Seen near Lake Mayara.

**Sykes's Monkey** Cercopithecus albogularis — Seen in Arusha NP.

**Vervet Monkey** *Chlorocebus pygerythrus* — Seen regularly.

Olive Baboon Papio anubis — Many sightings.

Black-and-white Colobus Colobus guereza — Seen at Arusha NP and in western Serengeti.

**Unstriped Ground Squirrel** *Xerus rutilus* — Just one sighting at Engikaret.

**Unstriped Grass Rat** *Arvicanthis niloticus* — Seen around Ndutu

Cape Hare Lepus capensis or African Savanna Hare Lepus victoriae/microtis — Several hares seen could not be identified to species.

**Yellow-winged Bat** *Lavia frons* — Seen in the Serengeti.

**Cheetah** *Acinonyx jubatus* — Two excellent encounters with a single animal near Ndutu and a three-male-coalition in the Serengeti.

**Lion** *Panthera leo* — Many, many sightings, including small cubs, a mating pair and feeding on a kill.

**Leopard** *Panthera pardus***n** — Two excellent sightings in the Serengeti; one female in a tree which we watched descend and join up with two tiny cubs, and one watching a pair of mating lions at close range...

**Common Genet** *Genetta* [genetta] genetta — One tame animal seen at Ndutu.

Common Slender Mongoose [S M] Galerella [sanguinea] sanguinea — One brief sighting in the Serengeti.

Common Dwarf Mongoose Helogale parvula - Excellent sightings at Tarangire, Ndutu and Serengeti.

White-tailed Mongoose Ichneumia albicauda — Great night-time views near Lake Manyara.

Banded Mongoose Mungos mungo — Some excellent encounters in the game parks.

**Spotted Hyaena** *Crocuta crocuta* — Many in the Serengeti and at Ngorongoro, including some great interactions around a kill.

African Golden Wolf [G Jackal] Canis [aureus] anthus - Good sightings at Serengeti and Ngorongoro.

Black-backed Jackal Canis mesomelas — Seen near Lake Mayara and in the Serengeti.

**Plains Zebra** *Equus* [quagga] burchellii — Many in the game parks.

Black Rhinoceros Diceros bicornis — Three seen on two occasions at Ngorongoro.

Common Warthog Phacochoerus africanus — Seen regularly in the game parks.

Common Hippopotamus Hippopotamus amphibius — Many in the Serengeti.

Giraffe Giraffa camelopardalis — Many good sightings in the game parks.

Common Impala [I] Aepyceros [melampus] melampus — Seen in Tarangire and the Serengeti.

Kongoni [H] Alcelaphus [buselaphus] cokii — Good views in the Serengeti.

Eastern White-bearded Wildebeest [Blue W] Connochaetes [taurinus] albojubatus — Seen near Lake Manyara and at Tarangire.

Serengeti White-bearded Wildebeest [Blue W] Connochaetes [taurinus] mearnsi — Just a few in the Serengeti, including some big groups on the

Serengeti Topi [Common Tsessebe] Damaliscus [lunatus] jimela — Good views in the Serengeti.

Eastern Thomson's Gazelle [T G] Eudorcas [thomsonii] thomsonii — A few seen distantly at Engikaret.

Western Thomson's Gazelle [T G] Eudorcas [thomsonii] nasalis — Many in the Serengeti and at Ngorongoro.

Naivasha Dik-dik [Kirk's D] Madoqua [kirkii] cavendishi — Seen in the Serengeti.

Thomas's Dik-dik [Kirk's D] Madoqua [kirkii] thomasi — Seen at Tarangire and near Lake Manyara.

Grant's Gazelle Nanger [granti] granti — Good numbers in the Serengeti system.

Masai Klipspringer [K] Oreotragus [oreotragus] schillingsi — One seen in the Serengeti.

**Cape Buffalo** *Syncerus* [caffer] caffer — Good numbers in the game parks.

Common Eland Taurotragus oryx — Seen well several times in the Serengeti system.

Mountain Blue Duiker [B D] Philantomba [monticola] lugens — Good views of one at Arusha


**Bush Duiker** *Sylvicapra* [grimmia] grimmia — Just one near Lake Manyara.
